2017 SAN BENITO COUNTY SENIOR FACT SHEET

Population Changes

- The 60+ population has increased by 26% since 2011.
- 1,640 of the County's 11,296 seniors are eligible for Medi-Cal
- The Over-60 Medi-Cal Eligible population grew 56.8% since 2011
- 8% of the population consumes 75% of the health care costs, with the vast majority being seniors with chronic conditions
- 9 people per week turned 60 in San Benito County in 2016
- 2 Medi-Cal eligible County residents turned 60 every week, accounting for 20% of the increase over the past sixyears
- 42% of all older San Benitians (age 65+) do not have enough income to meet their basic needs, according to UCLA's Elder Economic Security Index
- 1,000 Californians are turning 65 every day for the next fifteen years
- Seniors are the fastest growing age group in California and the United States. The 65-74 age group is projected to grown by 20.7% over the next 5 years (compared to 4.7% for all age groups).

Food-insecure seniors are at greater risk for chronic health conditions and are:

- 60 percent more likely to experience depression
- 53 percent more likely to report a heart attack
- 52 percent more likely to develop asthma
- 40 percent more likely to report an experience of congestive heart failure

Elder Abuse

- Financial abuse cases of seniors rose 41% between 2009 and 2013 in California
- Adult Protective Services workers receive only 4 cents of every dollar of state and federally funded training that is provided to Child Welfare workers

Senior Services Funding and the Cost of Long Term Care

- The average cost of a nursing home in California is over \$86,000 per year
- Funding for Older Americans Act programs is at 1984-85 levels.
- State funding for Older Californians Act Programs has been eliminated.
- Successful programs such as Linkages have been closed
